## Ekal Sa Re Ta Re - Non-Classical Indian and Western Solo Singing Competition Format and Rules

## Categories (Non-Classical Indian & Non-Classical Western Singing)

- Kinder Level (5 years to 8 years)
- Junior Level (9 years to 12 years)
- Youth Level (13 years to 16 years)

#### **Performance Time**

- 1. Non-classical Indian (Any Indian language song/ movie song): The performance must be between 3 to 5 minutes in all categories.
- 2. Non-classical Western: (English Language)The performance must be between 2.5 to 5 minutes in all categories.

#### Rules

# Ekal Sa Re Ta Re reserves the right to make changes to the event. Any changes to the event will be communicated to the registered participants

- 1. Category Participation: Each individual may perform either Indian/Western or both categories.
- 2. Karaoke Usage Requirement: The use of karaoke tracks is mandatory.
- **3. MP3 Karaoke Track**: To qualify for participation, contestants must submit a complete karaoke track in MP3 format only when requested by Ekal Sa Re Ta Re, not required at the time of registration.
- **4. Vocal-Only Performances:** All performances must be purely vocal; no live instruments are allowed to accompany the singers on stage.
- **5. Age Eligibility**: Participants must fall within the specified age range as of January 1, 2023. Proof of age may be requested.
- **6. Age Verification:** Ekal Sa Re Ta Re reserves the right to request proof of age to verify a participant's eligibility if necessary.
- **7. Segment Cancellation:** Any category with only one entry may be canceled. Individuals have the option to compete in a higher age category if allowed by the rules.
- **8. Semi-Finals for Overcrowded Categories:** In the event of an excessive number of entries in any category, Ekal Sa Re Ta Re may conduct semi-final rounds.
- **9. No Audience Prompting or Coaching:** Audience members are prohibited from providing any prompting or coaching to participants. Violation will result in immediate disqualification.
- **10. No Written Lyrics or Supporting Devices:** Participants are strictly forbidden from using written lyrics or any devices to aid their performance on stage. Violation will lead to immediate disqualification.
- **12. Song Submission:** Songs must be sent to the Ekal Sa Re Ta Re team in MP3 format when requested. Non-compliance will lead to disqualification.
- **13. Time Limit:** Contestants must complete their songs within 15 seconds after the time limit buzzer sounds. Exceeding this limit will result in immediate disqualification.

- **14. No Instrumental Support:** Ekal Sa Re Ta Re will not provide any instrumental support for the singers.
- **15. Finality of Judges' Decisions:** Judges' decisions are final, and participants or their parents are not allowed to contact judges directly or indirectly for performance feedback.

# **Definition of Judging Criteria**

## Pitch Accuracy (40% of Total Score)

Points are awarded based on the ability to maintain correct pitch.

# Rhythm Mastery (35% of Total Score)

 Points are awarded based on the participant's skill in maintaining rhythm throughout the performance.

## **Presentation Quality (25% of Total Score)**

- Pronunciation and diction.
- Quality of improvisation...
- Recovery from mistakes.
- Eye contact with the audience.
- The overall feeling and look of enjoyment.
- Total stage presence.

#### **Penalty**

• If a participant is unprepared or not ready to perform when their number is called, a penalty of 5 points will be deducted from their cumulative score.

#### Winners

- **1. Single Participant:** If only one participant registers for a category, there won't be a competition, and that participant can choose to compete in a higher age category.
- **2. Two or More Participants:** If there are at least two participants in a category, a first-place winner will be declared.
- **3. Three or More Participants:** If there are at least three participants in a category, a first-place winner and a second-place winner will be declared.
- **4. Four or More Participants:** If there are at least four participants in a category, a first-place winner, a second-place winner, and a third-place winner will be declared.

Please Note: Judges' decisions are considered final.
