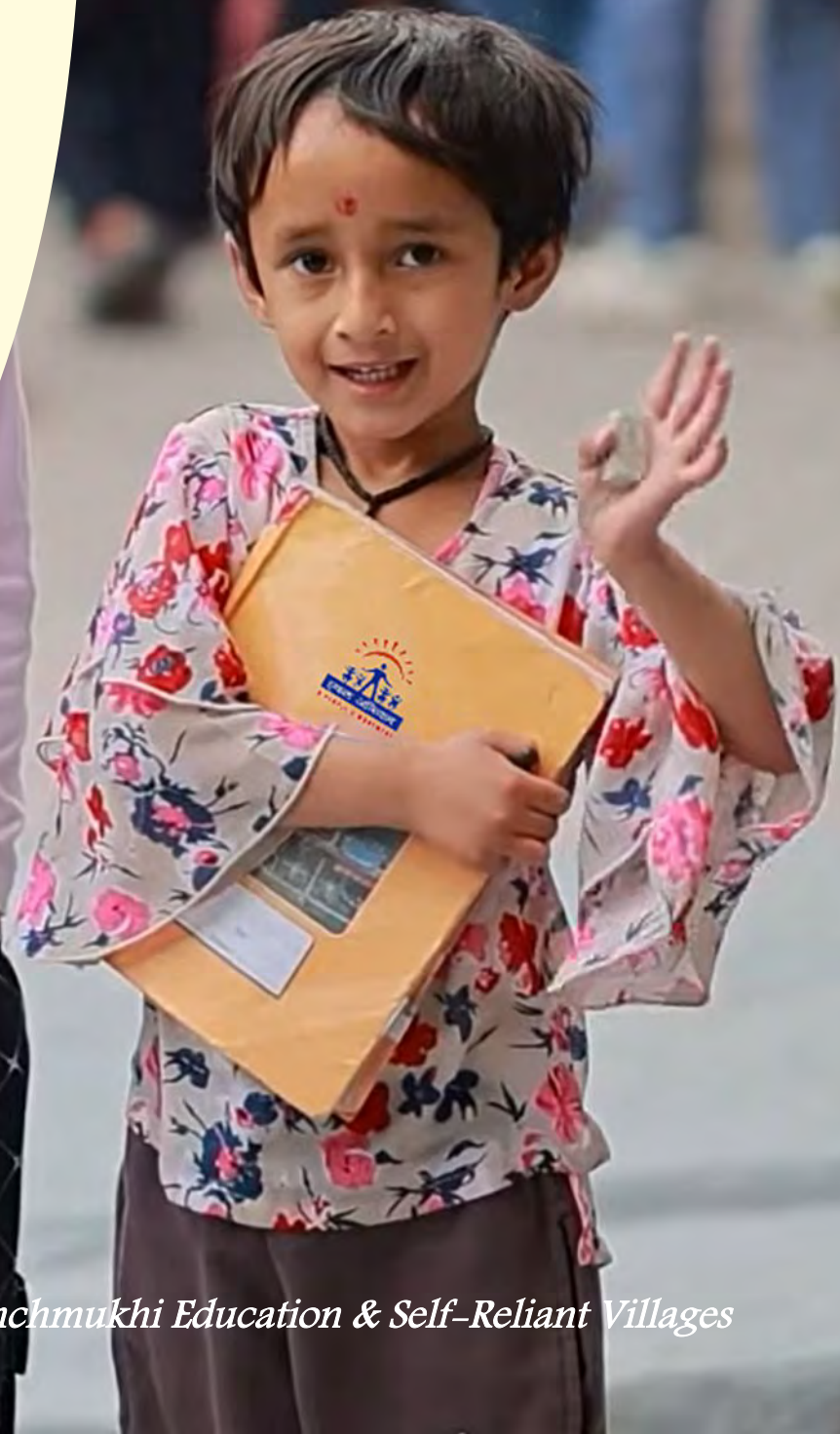

Report by President CEC

- Ekal Abhiyan

The year 2025-26 has been another significant year in the journey of Ekal Abhiyan toward building an educated, self-reliant, healthy and culturally awakened Bharat. Guided by the philosophy of Panchmukhi Shiksha, Ekal Abhiyan continues to expand its grassroots efforts across remote tribal, border, rural and underserved regions of the country.

As on 31st March 2026, 90,603 Ekal schools are functioning across 26 states, covering 391 districts and 3,539 blocks. Through these schools, education is being provided to 23,86,677 children, including 11,99,739 girl students. More than 10.3 million students have passed through the Ekal education system so far. In addition, 120 E-Shiksha Sanch covering nearly 3,600 villages are strengthening digital learning in rural Bharat.

Health and wellness initiatives under Arogya Yojana reached 49,34,850 beneficiaries through 115 Arogya Resource Centers (ARC) functioning in 3,210 villages. Gramothan initiatives focusing on skill development, self-reliance, entrepreneurship and Integrated Village Development (IVD) impacted over 14,11,614 beneficiaries through various projects and centers.

Village-level participation continued to grow through Panchmukhi activities related to organic farming, nutritional gardens, dairy development, environmental awareness, social welfare and financial inclusion. During the year, over 10.75 lakh trees were planted, while lakhs of villagers benefitted through various awareness and empowerment initiatives.

Our Sanskar Shiksha activities also continued to strengthen cultural values and social harmony through 53,344 Sanskar Kendra and 123 Ekal Shrihari Mandir Rath with participation of more than 28 lakh people.

These achievements have been possible due to the dedicated efforts of Teachers, Karyakarta, volunteers, donors and well-wishers associated with Ekal Abhiyan. Their commitment continues to strengthen this movement of national reconstruction and rural transformation.

As we move forward, Ekal Abhiyan will continue to focus on quality education, integrated village development, digital empowerment, women's self-reliance, youth participation and expansion in tribal, border and sensitive regions of Bharat.

Holistic Development for National Integration



The strength of Bharat lies not only in its cities and institutions but in the millions of rural, tribal and border communities that preserve the nation's cultural heritage, social values and traditional wisdom. Recognizing the need for holistic and sustainable rural development, Ekal Abhiyan emerged as a people's movement dedicated to transforming villages through education, awareness, self-reliance and social awakening.

Founded on the philosophy of "Gramotthan se Rashtrtathan" (National Reconstruction through Village Development), Ekal Abhiyan believes that true transformation can occur only when education is integrated with health, livelihood, cultural values and community organization. This vision gave rise to the concept of Panchmukhi Shiksha, a five-dimensional model of education and development designed to create empowered and self-reliant rural communities.

The five dimensions of Panchmukhi Shiksha include:

- **Primary Education:** Ensuring access to basic and value-based education for children in remote villages through Ekal Vidyalaya (EV).
- **Arogya Education:** Promoting preventive healthcare, nutrition awareness, hygiene and wellness.
- **Gram Vikas Education:** Encouraging self-reliance through skill development, entrepreneurship and sustainable livelihoods.
- **Empowerment Education:** Creating awareness about govt. schemes, social participation, sense of citizenship and community leadership.
- **Cultural Education:** Strengthening Bharatiya values, traditions, social harmony and cultural identity.

The Ekal Model

The Ekal model is a low-cost, high-impact, community-based development model designed specifically for remote rural and tribal regions. The model combines education, awareness, local participation, volunteerism and village-level leadership to create sustainable transformation.

Each Ekal unit functions not merely as a school but as a center for community development, social awareness and grassroots empowerment.

Community Participation: The Foundation of the Ekal Model

A distinguish feature of Ekal Abhiyan is its strong emphasis on community ownership and participation. Every Ekal Vidyalaya functions not merely as an educational center but as a catalyst for village-level organization and collective action.

To ensure effective management of the school and the holistic development of the village, a Gram Karyakarini is constituted in each Ekal Vidyalaya village. The committee is structured around seven sub-committees representing the five dimensions of Panchmukhi Shiksha, along with dedicated committees for youth and women. Each sub-committee comprises active villagers who contribute their time, ideas and leadership toward community development.

Through this structure, nearly 40–50 families in every village are directly involved in planning, supporting and monitoring developmental activities. Such widespread participation fosters a strong sense of ownership and responsibility among villagers, transforming beneficiaries into active stakeholders in the progress of village. Although, only 6-7 active members do this job, practically.



The seven sub-committees are led by committed village representatives who collectively form the Gram Samiti, providing leadership and direction to local initiatives. Their efforts are further supported by the Sanch Samiti which ensures regular coordination, guidance and sustained community engagement. Parents of Ekal students also play an active role in this process, strengthening the connection between the school, families and the wider community.

This unique participatory framework creates a vibrant network of local leadership, encourages collective decision-making and builds social centre within villages. More importantly, it nurtures a spirit of self-reliance and shared responsibility, ensuring that village development becomes a community-driven movement rather than an externally driven intervention.

At its core, the Ekal model seeks not only to educate children but also to awaken society. By mobilizing families, youth, women and community leaders around a common vision of development, Ekal transforms villages into active partners in the larger mission of national integration.

Over the years, Ekal Abhiyan has evolved into one of the largest grassroots educational movements in the world. As on 31st March 2026, Ekal Abhiyan is operating:

- **90,603 Ekal Schools**
- **Reaching 23,86,677 students**
- **Across 1,07,985 villages**
- **In 26 states**
- **Covering 391 districts & 3,539 blocks**

National Reconstruction through Village Development

Ekal Abhiyan believes that sustainable national development begins with empowered villages rooted in education, self-reliance, health awareness, cultural values and social participation.

The movement has impacted more than 10.3 million students over the years, creating long-term educational and social transformation in rural Bharat.

Special emphasis continues to be placed on tribal, border and socially sensitive regions where access to education and development opportunities remain limited. Ekal's grassroots presence in these areas helps strengthen social confidence, local leadership and national integration while preserving indigenous traditions and community identity.



In recent years, Ekal Abhiyan has also integrated digital learning initiatives through E-Shiksha programs, skill development centers, health awareness campaigns, women empowerment initiatives and integrated village development projects. These efforts are helping bridge developmental gaps while preparing rural communities for emerging opportunities in a rapidly changing world.

The vision of Ekal Abhiyan goes beyond literacy. It seeks to create awakened, self-reliant, culturally rooted and socially responsible communities capable of contributing meaningfully to nation-building. Through collective participation, volunteerism and community ownership, Ekal Abhiyan continues its mission of transforming villages and strengthening the foundation of a strong, united and empowered Bharat.

Education with Value and Ethics



Education is the foundation of individual's empowerment and national development. For millions of children living in remote tribal, rural, border and underserved regions of Bharat, access to quality education continues to be a challenge. Ekal Abhiyan addresses this challenge through its unique and community-driven educational model that combines literacy, values, life skills and social awareness.

The Ekal education system is designed not only to impart basic learning but also to nurture confidence, character, leadership and a sense of responsibility among children. Through active community participation and local ownership, Ekal schools have become centres of learning, social engagement and village development.

Reaching the Last Mile

As on 31st March 2026, Ekal Abhiyan is operating:

- **90,603 Ekal Schools**
- **23,86,677 Students**
- **11,86,938 Boys**
- **11,99,739 Girls**
- **10.3 million Students Passed Out Since Inception**

These schools are functioning across some of the most difficult and geographically isolated regions of the country, ensuring that basic informal education reaches children who otherwise have limited access to formal learning opportunities.

Education Rooted in Values

The Ekal model integrates academic learning with value-based education. Daily activities include prayers, patriotic songs, storytelling, group discussions, Yoga, games and community participation exercises that help children develop discipline, teamwork, respect for culture and social responsibility.

The focus remains on creating confident and responsible citizens who are connected to their roots while being prepared for future opportunities.



Sanskar Kendra: Nurturing Values from an Early Age

Sanskar Kendra serves as vibrant platforms for value education and personality development. Through stories from Indian history, cultural activities, group learning and celebrations of national festivals, children are introduced to the ideals of service, patriotism, social harmony and ethical conduct.

These centers play an important role in preserving cultural traditions while strengthening the moral foundation of future generations.

Digital Learning for Rural Bharat

Recognizing the growing importance of technology in education, Ekal Abhiyan continues to expand digital learning initiatives through innovative E-Shiksha programs.

E-Shiksha Sanch (Cluster of 30 EV Villages)

- 120 E-Shiksha Sanch
- Covering approximately 3,600 Villages

These centers provide access to digital content, interactive learning modules and technology-enabled educational resources that help bridge the digital divide in rural communities.

Digital education initiatives enable students to gain exposure to modern learning methods

while enhancing their understanding of mathematics, science, language and general knowledge.

Learning Innovations

Ekal schools adopt activity-based and child-friendly teaching methodologies designed to make learning enjoyable and effective. Local teachers use songs, games, storytelling, practical demonstrations and community participation to improve student engagement and retention.

Continuous innovation in teaching practices helps create an interactive learning environment where children actively participate in the educational process. Key innovations include- Activity-based learning, Experiential teaching methods, Community-supported learning, Digital educational tools, Local language instruction & Value-based learning modules.

Technology-Enabled Monitoring and School Management

To further strengthen the quality and regular functioning of Ekal schools, all three main organizations implementing **Ekal Vidyalaya - Friends of Tribal Society (FTS)**, **Bharat Lok Shiksha Parishad (BLSP)** and **Ekal Vidyalaya Foundation of India (EVFI)** continue to enhance technology-enabled monitoring and reporting systems during the year.

FTS significantly expanded the use of **Acharya and Karyakarta Mobile Applications**, enabling digital attendance, school monitoring and field-level reporting. By March 2026, nearly 60% of teacher attendance and 78% of Karyakarta attendance were being recorded through the mobile applications. The Acharya App was operational in 59% of FTS-run active Ekal Vidyalaya, while digital honorarium payments were successfully introduced across all 17 Anchals of Bengal, laying the foundation for a transparent and efficient nationwide payment system.

BLSP strengthened its monitoring framework by implementing a Google Form-based

reporting system, allowing Acharya and Karyakarta to submit daily attendance, work reports, geo-tagged photographs and location details digitally. This initiative has improved the accuracy, transparency and reliability of reporting while enabling real-time monitoring and greater accountability. During the year, BLSP also undertook an Internal Impact Assessment of its Ekal Vidyalaya covering geographical accessibility, socio-economic challenges, educational quality, multiplier effects and Panchmukhi Shiksha needs.

EVFI initiated the implementation of Acharya and Karyakarta App across its operational areas during the year. As the system is progressively rolled out, it is expected to strengthen digital reporting, improve field monitoring and ensure more effective tracking of school functioning, attendance and Karyakarta visits.

Collectively, these initiatives reflect Ekal Abhiyan's growing commitment to integrating technology with grassroots education, enhancing operational efficiency, improving transparency and ensuring that every Ekal Vidyalaya functions regularly and effectively in even the most remote parts of Bharat.

Improving Attendance and Learning Outcomes

Community ownership and regular

engagement with parents continue to strengthen attendance and participation in Ekal schools. Teachers maintain close interaction with families and village committees to encourage regular attendance and support children's educational progress. The increasing participation of girl students reflects growing awareness regarding the importance of education and gender inclusion in rural communities. Ekal's educational interventions have helped improve the basic literacy and numeracy skills, school readiness among children, regular attendance, confidence and communication skills, social participation and leadership qualities and transition to higher levels of education.

Transforming Lives Through Education

Over the years, Ekal education has transformed the lives of millions of children by providing opportunities for learning, personal growth and social empowerment. Many former students have continued their education, pursued vocational training, become entrepreneurs, or emerged as community leaders contributing to local development.

With more than 10.3 million students having benefited from the Ekal education system since inception, the movement continues to create lasting impact across rural Bharat.

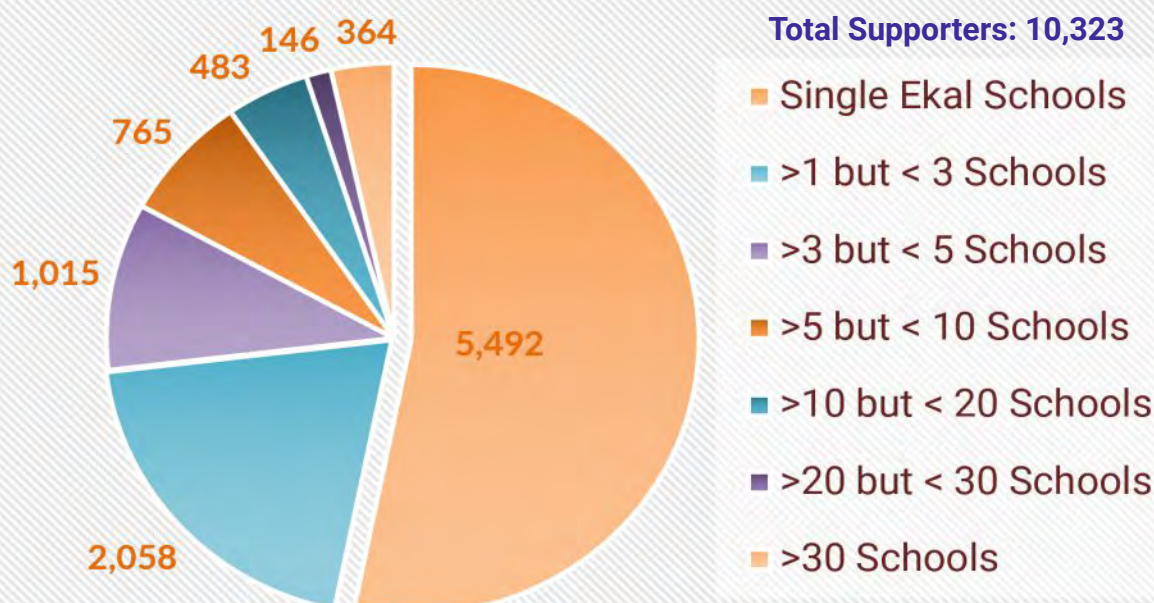

Number of supporters as per size of support for Ekal Schools in 2025-26

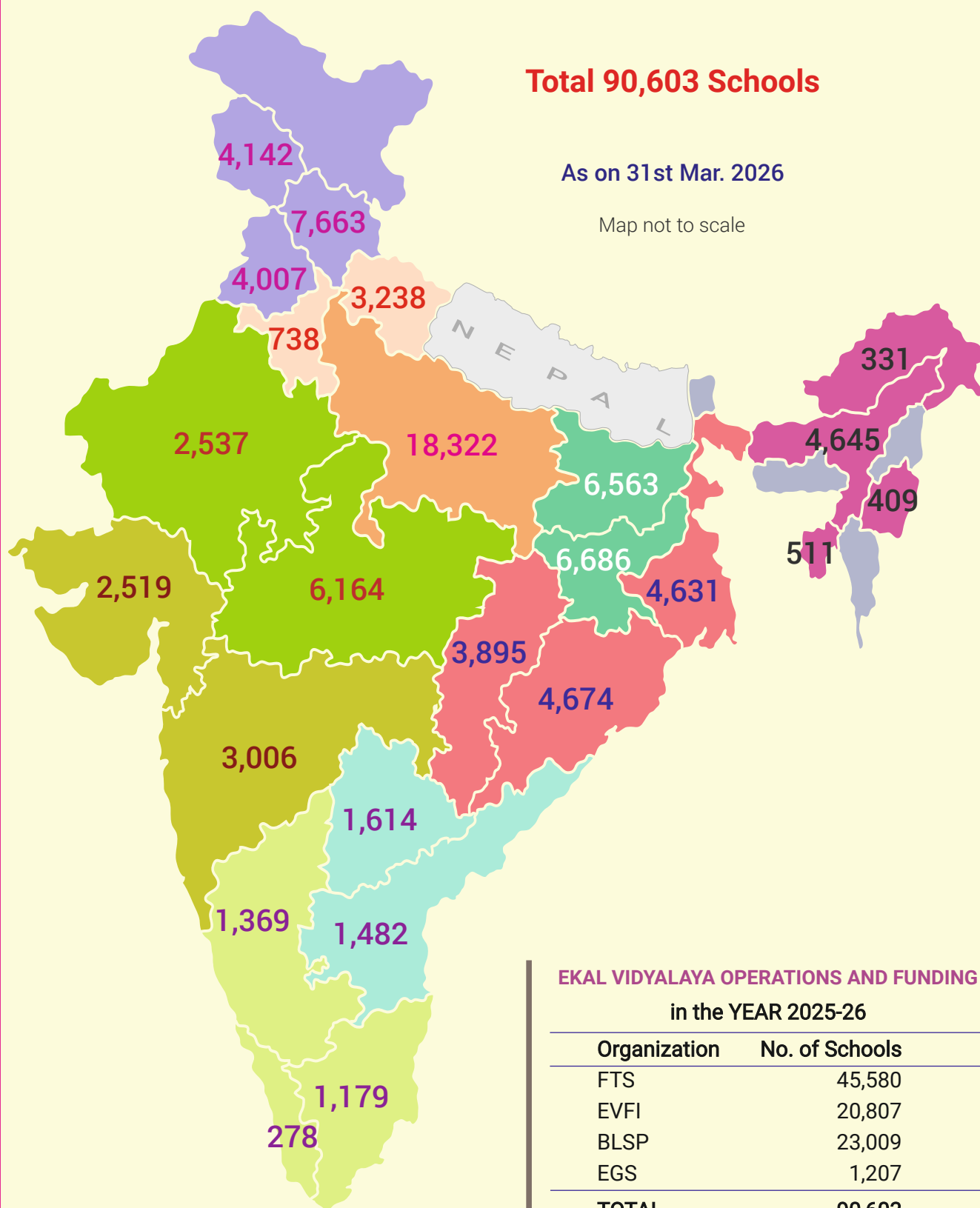


Ekal Schools Operation and Management

Arogya Shiksha

Healthy Villages, Strong Communities



A healthy society is the foundation of sustainable development. Recognizing that access to healthcare remains a challenge in many rural, tribal and remote regions of Bharat, Ekal Abhiyan established Arogya Foundation of India (AFI) to promote preventive healthcare, community awareness and village-level health leadership. Since its inception in 2003, AFI has worked to improve the health and well-being of marginalized communities by combining traditional knowledge, modern medical practices and community participation.

AFI's approach extends beyond treatment. It focuses on empowering communities to adopt healthy lifestyles, improve nutrition, prevent disease and access healthcare services through trained local women health workers known as Arogya Sevika. These Sevika serve as trusted health ambassadors, connecting villagers with healthcare information, screening services, telemedicine facilities and government health schemes.

Expanding Reach and Impact

During 2025–26, AFI significantly strengthened its presence across rural Bharat, reaching **64,56,881 beneficiaries** through a wide range of preventive healthcare, awareness, screening and community health initiatives.

Geographic Presence

The programme continued to expand in both standalone Arogya Sanch and integrated development locations under IVD and Adarsh Sanch initiatives.

Women Leading Community Health

At the heart of AFI's model are 1,755 Arogya Sevika, trained local women who serve as the first point of contact for health awareness and preventive healthcare within their communities.

Supported by doctors, coordinators and technical teams, these Sevika educate families on hygiene, nutrition, maternal health, anaemia prevention, sanitation and home-based healthcare practices. Their grassroots presence ensures that healthcare awareness reaches even the most remote villages.

Building Healthy Villages

AFI promotes the concept of the Arogya Gram, where communities are encouraged to adopt preventive health practices and healthy living habits. These interventions contribute to improved sanitation, nutrition, environmental sustainability and disease prevention at the village level. During the year, villagers actively participated in creating healthier living environments through different activities as mentioned in the chart.

Health Awareness at Scale

Community awareness remains a cornerstone of AFI's healthcare strategy. Through regular family visits, school programmes, rallies and educational campaigns, millions of villagers received critical health information during the year. These initiatives helped improve awareness regarding hygiene, nutrition, sanitation, disease prevention and healthy lifestyle.

Telemedicine: Bringing Healthcare Closer

To bridge the healthcare gap in remote areas, AFI continues to expand its Telemedicine Enhanced Arogya (TEA) programme. Through digital health consultations and village-level screening, telemedicine enables rural communities to access qualified medical advice without travelling long distances. The programme represents a significant step toward integrating technology with grassroots healthcare delivery.

Restoring Vision Through Eye Care

AFI's Eye Care initiatives continued to address vision-related challenges in underserved communities through Eye Van and Chashma Projects implemented across multiple states. Thousands of villagers received eye screening, consultations, medicines and corrective eyewear through these interventions, helping improve quality of life and productivity, particularly among school children and elderly beneficiaries.

Capacity Building for Sustainable Healthcare

Strengthening the skills of frontline health workers remains a key priority. During the year, AFI organized extensive training programmes covering anatomy, nutrition, anaemia management, hygiene, telemedicine operations, herbal remedies, medicine orientation and community health leadership. More than 235 coordinators and hundreds of Sevika participated in specialized training and refresher programmes, ensuring continuous improvement in service delivery and healthcare outcomes.



Innovation, Partnerships and Global Engagement

The year witnessed several notable initiatives, including a 21-day Pre-Medical Internship Programme for students from the United States in collaboration with EVF_USA. The programme provided participants with firsthand exposure to rural healthcare system, telemedicine initiatives, Ayurveda and community development activities.

AFI also showcased its grassroots healthcare model at national and international forums, including the EVF_USA National Conference in Orlando, strengthening global awareness and support for rural healthcare initiatives in Bharat.



A significant organizational milestone was achieved with the inauguration of **AFI's first chapter in Kanpur**, creating a foundation for wider outreach, volunteer engagement and regional collaboration.

Looking Ahead

AFI remains committed to strengthening preventive healthcare system in rural Bharat. Future priorities include:

- Expanding Telemedicine Enhanced Arogya across all Sanch.
- Scaling operations progressively towards 500 Sanch nationwide.
- Strengthening non-communicable disease interventions.
- Certification and advanced capacity building of Arogya Sevika.
- Enhancing livelihood opportunities through herbal and compost-based enterprises.
- Establishing additional regional chapters for wider outreach.

Through empowered women health workers, community participation, innovative healthcare solutions and a commitment to preventive care, Arogya Foundation of India continues to build healthier villages and stronger communities across Bharat.



Gram Vikas Shiksha

Transforming Villages Through Skills and Livelihood



Sustainable rural development is achieved when communities are empowered with knowledge, skills, livelihoods and opportunities for self-reliance. Guided by this belief, Ekal Gramothan Foundation (EGF) works to strengthen rural and tribal communities through skill development, women empowerment, entrepreneurship promotion, sustainable agriculture and integrated village development initiatives.

The Gramothan model seeks to transform villages into self-sustaining units by enhancing the capacities of individuals, particularly youth and women, while promoting local livelihoods and community-led development. Through a network of resource centres, training institutions and development projects, EGF continues to create pathways for economic empowerment and social progress across rural Bharat, also to ensure reduction in migration to urban area.

Expanding Opportunities, Transforming Lives

The year 2025–26 marked another phase of significant growth and impact. EGF expanded its outreach through a diverse portfolio of projects focused on skill development, livelihood generation, digital literacy, women empowerment and integrated village development.

A total of **76,653 beneficiaries** were reached during FY 2025–2026, including 71,828 beneficiaries through the main centres and an additional 4,825 beneficiaries through Satellite Centres, expanding the outreach to remote and underserved communities. The year witnessed the expansion of active projects from 240 to 289, strengthening EGF's presence across rural and tribal regions and creating new opportunities for community development.

Building Skills for Sustainable Livelihoods

Skill development remains one of the most effective tools for economic empowerment. EGF's training centres provide practical, market-oriented skills that enhance employability, entrepreneurship and income generation opportunities for rural youth and particularly women.



Training programmes during the year focused on:

- Computer Education
- Tailoring and Apparel Skills
- Entrepreneurship Development
- Digital Literacy
- Women Empowerment Initiatives
- Employment-Oriented Vocational Courses

To further improve instructional quality, EGF conducted specialized Master Training Programmes for computer and English trainers, introducing modern teaching methodologies, digital tools and innovative learning practices.

Adapting to Emerging Opportunities

Keeping pace with changing market demands, EGF introduced several new vocational courses during the year, including:

- Mobile Repairing
- Beautician Training
- Electrician Training Courses



These programmes were designed to provide practical skills aligned with local employment opportunities and emerging livelihood needs. Additionally, short-duration job-oriented courses were introduced to enable youth and working individuals to acquire employable skills within a shorter timeframe.

A major milestone was the development of Computer Compass, a standardized curriculum designed to strengthen and streamline computer education across all training centres.

Integrated Village Development: A Holistic Approach

The Integrated Village Development (IVD) model remains a cornerstone of EGF's efforts toward holistic rural transformation. Through convergence of education, health, livelihoods, women empowerment, agriculture and community organization, IVD projects create visible and measurable change at the village level. To strengthen implementation quality, EGF constituted a dedicated joint field and Headquarter monitoring team that regularly visits project locations, provides training support, reviews progress and promotes



continuous improvement. This integrated approach ensures that development interventions are community-driven, sustainable and aligned with local needs.

Strengthening Rural Livelihoods

Agriculture and allied activities continue to play a crucial role in rural economies. EGF promoted sustainable farming practices and livelihood enhancement initiatives through training, awareness and resource support.

Environmental Sustainability

Recognizing the importance of ecological conservation, EGF integrated environmental awareness into its development programmes.



A nationwide plantation campaign distributed 1,32,506 saplings to 112 farmers and community members at 1111 locations, encouraging agroforestry, environmental stewardship and sustainable land-use practices. These initiatives contributed to greener villages while supporting long-term agricultural sustainability.

Empowering Communities Through Technology

Digital literacy and technological empowerment remain key priorities in preparing rural communities for future opportunities.

Cyber Security Awareness Camps were organized across villages to educate youth and community members about:

- Online safety
- Secure digital transactions
- Prevention of cyber fraud
- Responsible use of digital technologies

These initiatives have become increasingly important as digital penetration continues to expand across rural Bharat.

Strategic Partnership with IGNTU: Enhancing the Value of Skill Development

One of the landmark achievements during the year was the strengthening of Ekal Gramothan Foundation's collaboration with Indira Gandhi National Tribal University (IGNTU), Amarkantak. Through this partnership, both institutions introduced joint certification for selected skill development programmes, integrating academic recognition with industry-relevant vocational training.

The initiative significantly enhances the credibility and employability of trainees by providing certifications jointly endorsed by



EGF and a Central University. It also lays the foundation for broader collaboration in curriculum development, capacity building, research, field-based learning and tribal development, further strengthening EGF's commitment to creating sustainable livelihood opportunities for rural and tribal youth.

Community Participation and Social Engagement

Community ownership is central to the success of Gramothan initiatives. Throughout the year, centres organized awareness camps, cultural celebrations, certificate distribution ceremonies and community engagement programmes that strengthened local participation and encouraged greater involvement in developmental activities.

Many centres also celebrated national and cultural festivals, creating opportunities for social harmony, value education and community bonding. Alumni engagement and success-story sharing further inspired current trainees and reinforced the long-term impact of skill development programmes.

An innovative initiative, Run for Ekal was launched in Karnataka, bringing together volunteers, youth and community members in a '160-kilometre Relay Run' awareness campaign promoting fitness, social responsibility and rural development.



Creating Local Leadership and Employment

One of the most encouraging developments during the year was the recruitment of successful alumni as trainers and mobilizers at various centres. This initiative not only created employment opportunities but also strengthened local ownership, trust and community engagement.

The success of former trainees demonstrates the transformative potential of skill-based education and livelihood support.

Looking Ahead

As EGF continues to grow, its focus remains on expanding high-impact programmes, strengthening training quality, promoting entrepreneurship and building self-reliant communities.

Key priorities for the future include:

- Expansion of successful project models to new regions.
- Advanced skill development programmes.
- Promotion of nutritional gardening and organic farming.
- Support for micro-enterprises and rural entrepreneurship.
- Strengthening digital systems for monitoring and transparency.
- Introduction of digital fee-payment systems.
- Enhanced community participation and local leadership development.

Through skill development, livelihood creation, sustainable agriculture and integrated village development, Ekal Gramothan Foundation continues to empower individuals, strengthen communities and advance the vision of a self-reliant and prosperous rural Bharat.

Empowered Citizens, Participative Democracy



A strong nation is built not only through economic progress but also through informed, responsible and actively engaged citizens. Recognizing the importance of civic participation in national development, Ekal Abhiyan's Jan Jagran and Civic Awareness initiatives seek to strengthen democratic values, constitutional awareness, social responsibility and community leadership at the grassroots level.

Working primarily in rural, tribal, border and underserved regions, these initiatives aim to create awareness about citizens' rights and responsibilities while encouraging active participation in social and developmental processes. Through village-level engagement, awareness campaigns, leadership development programmes and community dialogue, Ekal Abhiyan continues to nurture informed and empowered communities capable of contributing meaningfully to nation-building.

Building Awareness, Strengthening Democracy

Democracy flourishes when citizens are aware, informed and actively involved in the development of their communities. Ekal Abhiyan's Jan Jagran activities focus on empowering villagers with knowledge about governance, civic responsibilities, public welfare schemes and constitutional values.

By creating awareness and encouraging participation, these programmes help bridge the gap between citizens and institutions while strengthening trust, accountability and community ownership.

Promoting Voter Awareness

The right to vote is one of the most important pillars of democracy. Ekal Abhiyan regularly conducts voter awareness activities to encourage informed and responsible participation in the electoral process.

Through village meetings, discussions, awareness campaigns and community

interactions, citizens are encouraged to understand the importance of voting and their role in shaping the future of their communities and the nation. Special efforts are made to reach first-time voters, women and marginalized sections of society to ensure wider participation in democratic processes.

These initiatives contribute to strengthening democratic participation and fostering a culture of responsible citizenship.

Constitutional Awareness and Citizen Responsibility

Awareness of constitutional values is essential for building a just, inclusive and harmonious society. Jan Jagran programmes introduce villagers to the fundamental principles of the Constitution, emphasizing equality, justice, rights, duties and respect for diversity.

Recognizing this, Ekal Abhiyan introduced Sanskar Shiksha in 1996 as an integral component of its Panchmukhi Shiksha model. The initiative seeks to foster value-based living, cultural awareness, social harmony and spiritual strength among rural and tribal communities. The core objective of Sanskar Shiksha is to create a value-oriented social environment through cultural awakening and community integration. By strengthening faith, self-confidence, moral conduct and social responsibility, the initiative contributes to the holistic development of individuals and communities.

Objectives of Sanskar Shiksha

Sanskar Shiksha seeks to:

- Promote value-based living and ethical conduct.
- Strengthen inner strength through spiritual and cultural activities.
- Encourage social harmony and community participation.
- Create awareness against social evils, addictions and harmful practices.
- Strengthen respect for cultural traditions and indigenous heritage.
- Connect rural and tribal communities with the broader national mainstream.

A Community-Centric Cultural Movement

Sanskar Shiksha is implemented through a wide range of activities that engage children, youth, women, families and village communities. These programmes create

platforms for learning, dialogue, devotion, cultural expression and social interaction. The initiative focuses on strengthening both individual character and collective social consciousness through continuous community engagement.

Key Activities of Sanskar Shiksha

Kathakar Yojana and Training

Storytelling has always been an effective medium for transmitting values and cultural wisdom. Through Kathakar Yojana, local storytellers are identified and trained to conduct value-based discourses and community interactions that inspire positive social change.



Gram Katha and Satsang

Regular village-level Katha programmes and Satsang create opportunities for collective learning, reflection and social bonding. Through devotional discourses and community participation, these gatherings help strengthen moral values and social harmony.



Shri Hari Mandir Rath Yojana

Shri Hari Mandir Rath serves as a unique medium for cultural outreach and spiritual awakening. Rath welcome programmes, devotional gatherings, village deity worship, religious assemblies and cultural interactions help create a vibrant atmosphere of collective participation and cultural pride.



Bhajan Mandalis and Sundarkand Path

Bhajan Sandhya, devotional singing and Sundarkand recitations provide opportunities for spiritual enrichment while fostering unity and community engagement. These programmes help preserve cultural traditions and strengthen social cohesion.



Ekal Sur Taal

Ekal Sur Taal serves as a cultural platform for artistic expression through music, dance, drama and stage performances. All the artists are Ekal Karyakarta and Kathakar from rural and tribal area of Bharat and have been trained to perform. These programmes

communicate social messages, promote cultural values and inspire community participation, particularly among youth.



Creating Social Harmony and Cultural Confidence

Through its diverse activities, Sanskar Shiksha seeks to strengthen harmony among communities, encourage freedom from addiction and harmful practices and promote positive social behaviour. The initiative also nurtures a sense of collective responsibility and cultural confidence among villagers.

By engaging families, youth, women and community leaders in a shared cultural journey, Sanskar Shiksha contributes to the creation of stronger and more cohesive village communities.

Towards a Value-Based Society

The long-term vision of Sanskar Shiksha extends beyond cultural programmes. It seeks to build villages rooted in values, harmony, self-discipline and community participation. The initiative aspires to create socially conscious communities that preserve cultural traditions while actively contributing to national development.

Ekal Gram Sangathan

From Community Participation to People's Movement



Ekal Gram Sangathan is the community mobilisation pillar of Ekal Abhiyan, dedicated to transforming villages into self-reliant and socially responsible communities. It seeks to cultivate a sense of ownership among villagers by encouraging them to actively participate in education, healthcare, rural development, cultural preservation and community governance. Through Village, Sanch and Anchal Samiti, Gram Sangathan transforms beneficiaries into stakeholders, ensuring that every initiative becomes a people's movement driven by local leadership.

The organization works to strengthen grassroots institutions, develop dedicated teams of volunteers, activate community committees at every level and foster the spirit of "Dharti Ki Takat"- the collective strength, confidence and participation of village communities. By integrating local leadership with Ekal's Panchmukhi Shiksha model, Ekal Gram Sangathan provides the organisational foundation for sustainable rural transformation.

Strengthening Community Institutions

A major focus during the year was strengthening organizational structure through Samiti activation, leadership development and volunteer orientation. The Samiti Orientation Course (SOC) was conducted across Prabhag, Sambhag, Anchal and Sanch levels, equipping committee members with a common understanding of Ekal's philosophy, organisational structure and field responsibilities. By the end of the year, training had been completed in 282 Anchal and 394 Sanch with more than 42,000 committee members and Karyakarta participating across different organisational levels.



Major Highlights of 2025–26

Ekal Ko Jano - Expanding Public Participation

To introduce Ekal Abhiyan to new audience and strengthen public engagement, Ekal Gram Sangathan launched the "Ekal Ko Jano" initiative. The inaugural programme, held at the India International Centre, New Delhi on 21st March 2026 which brought together eminent academicians, authors, researchers and social leaders to discuss education, nation-building and community participation. During the programme, the national rollout of the initiative was announced with the vision of expanding it across states and districts to connect more citizens with Ekal's mission.



7th National Executive Committee Meeting

The two-day National Executive Committee Meeting, held in New Delhi on 6-7 Dec. 2025, brought together 121 delegates from across the country including Bhag, Sambhag and Prabhag Presidents, National office bearers and other invited members to review organisational progress and chart the future roadmap. Deliberations focused on organisational strengthening, youth participation, women's leadership, committee activation, volunteer development, field visits, coordination between urban and rural organisations, departmental progress and strategic priorities for expanding Ekal's grassroots presence.



International Day of Yoga

Ekal Abhiyan observed the International Yoga Day with remarkable public participation across the country. Yoga programmes were organised in 88,346 villages, engaging over 1 crore participants, while Yoga sessions in 79,291 Ekal Vidyalaya villages brought together more than 9.23 million women, men & children. The month-long national campaign promoted Yoga as a way of life and reinforced Ekal's commitment to holistic physical, mental & spiritual well-being.



Empowering Women through Community Leadership

The Mahila Vibhag continued to strengthen women's participation across every organisational level. With 43,735 active women members, the department promoted leadership, community outreach and organisational expansion through regular meetings, field visits, training programmes and systematic reporting. Major initiatives such as Sneha Sampark Parivar (SSP), Care Taker Mother (CTM) and Vatsalya Sanch deepened emotional support for volunteers, strengthened grassroots engagement and encouraged women to play a leading role in community development. The department also organised 156 Anchal-level training programmes, published the quarterly Matrushakti Spandan e-newsletter, promoted self-reliance through cottage industries and handicrafts and mobilised resources through community contributions.



Ekal Future

Empowering Youth for Nation-Building and Social Transformation



Ekal Future is the youth wing of Ekal Gram Sangathan, dedicated to inspiring young people to become active participants in nation-building through service, leadership and community engagement. Rooted in the ideals of Ekal Abhiyan, it provides meaningful opportunities for youth to connect with rural Bharat, preserve India's cultural heritage and contribute towards social transformation through volunteerism.

Through community outreach, cultural programmes, health initiatives, disaster relief, environmental awareness and value-based education, Ekal Future nurtures socially responsible, compassionate and committed young leaders. During 2025–26, the organisation expanded its activities across multiple regions, engaging youth in initiatives that strengthened community participation while promoting the spirit of "Seva, Sanskar and Samarpan."

Key Initiatives During 2025–26

Community Service & Social Outreach

Ekal Future organised a wide range of community service initiatives to support underprivileged families living in Shabari settlements. Volunteers conducted food kit distribution, blanket distribution, clothing distribution for children and family contact campaigns, strengthening community relationships while promoting compassion, dignity and social harmony. Festival outreach programmes during Deepawali, Holi Milan, Makar Sankranti, Raksha Bandhan, Hanuman Janmotsav and Sharad Purnima further reinforced cultural unity and community participation.



Healthcare & Humanitarian Initiatives

Healthcare remained a major focus during the year. The Ekal Rakta Veer initiative promoted voluntary blood donation and ensured timely blood support during emergencies. In collaboration with Arogya Foundation of India, RIMS Ranchi and NLU Ranchi, Ekal Future organised free eye and health check-up camps in Shabari settlements, extending preventive healthcare services and medical consultations to underserved communities.



Cultural & Value-Based Development

To nurture socially conscious and value-driven youth, Ekal Future conducted regular training programmes for students on Shabari Mata Aarti, Bharat Mata Aarti and Shri Ram Stuti, promoting patriotism, cultural awareness and moral values. Volunteers also rendered selfless service during Maha Shivratri and Durga Navami, assisting devotees through crowd management and service activities at temples, reflecting Ekal's commitment to cultural preservation and community responsibility.



Youth Engagement & Leadership

Ekal Future volunteers actively participated in various activities of Ekal Abhiyan Gram Pravas in Ekal villages and community awareness programmes, enabling young volunteers to understand grassroots realities while strengthening local institutions and encouraging active citizenship. These

initiatives provided practical leadership experiences and deepened youth participation in Ekal Abhiyan's mission.



Promoting Self-Reliance in Shabari Basti

Empowering women through sustainable livelihoods remained a significant focus of Ekal Future during 2025–26. Volunteers worked closely with women in Shabari Bastis to encourage self-reliance through skill development, entrepreneurship and community participation. By promoting income-generating opportunities and strengthening confidence among women, the initiative sought to improve household livelihoods while enabling them to play a more active role in the social and economic development of their communities. The programme reflects Ekal Future's commitment to transforming service into sustainable empowerment and fostering long-term community resilience.



The Road Ahead

Ekal Future aims to further strengthen youth participation by expanding its volunteer network, deepening engagement with educational institutions, promoting structured leadership development, scaling community service initiatives and creating greater opportunities for young people to contribute meaningfully to rural development, cultural preservation and nation-building through Ekal Abhiyan.



Ekal Sansthan

Building Knowledge, Inspiring Innovation



Ekal Sansthan serves as the knowledge, research and innovation arm of Ekal Abhiyan, supporting the continuous evolution of its Panchmukhi Shiksha model. By fostering academic partnerships, promoting research-based interventions, strengthening volunteer capacity and integrating technology into grassroots programmes, the Sansthan connects educational institutions, researchers, youth and development practitioners with the realities of rural and tribal Bharat. During 2025–26, Ekal Sansthan expanded its outreach through experiential learning programmes, university collaborations, digital innovation and organisational knowledge-sharing initiatives, reinforcing its role as the strategic think tank of Ekal Abhiyan.

Key Initiatives During 2025–26

Connecting Academia with Rural Bharat

A major focus during the year was strengthening collaboration between higher educational institutions and rural communities through experiential learning and community engagement.

Bhavishya Ki Ore Ek Udaan

In collaboration with Daulat Ram College, University of Delhi, Ekal Sansthan organised a four-day residential outreach programme from 16th to 19th June, 2025 for children from Allipur Village Ekal Vidyalaya, Faridabad. The programme exposed to university life for students while providing hands-on learning in science, digital literacy, Vedic Mathematics, environmental education, psychology, arts, sports and Yoga, creating an enriching educational experience beyond the classroom.



Ekal Campus Study Circle & Rural Immersion Programme

The Campus Study Circle organised at Acropolis College, Indore, brought together over 200 students, academicians, industry leaders and social workers to discuss sustainable rural development and youth participation in nation-building. A landmark outcome was the signing of an MoU to implement the Ekal Rural Immersion Programme (ERI), enabling undergraduate and postgraduate students to gain firsthand exposure to rural development through Ekal's grassroots initiatives.



Dream India Tour

Students from Avichi College of Arts and Science, Chennai, participated in the Dream India Tour, conducted from 12th to 17th March 2026, experiencing village life, interacting with Ekal teachers and communities and observing Panchmukhi Shiksha and E-Shiksha initiatives in remote areas. The programme encouraged social responsibility, leadership, empathy and a deeper understanding of rural India's developmental aspirations.

Driving Organisational Excellence

Ekal Sansthan Manthan

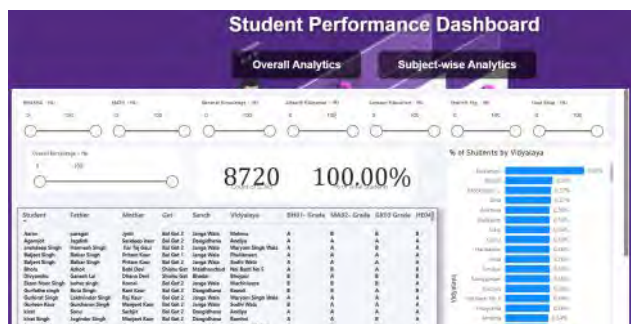
One of the year's most significant milestones was the organisation of the first Ekal Sansthan Manthan on 22nd March 2026, bringing together representatives of all major Ekal organisations on a common platform. The collaborative forum focused on developing a shared vision for organisational growth, research, digital transformation, governance, volunteer development, curriculum enhancement and impact assessment. The deliberations resulted in thematic working groups that will guide future institutional strengthening across Ekal Abhiyan.



Innovation & Digital Initiatives

- Mobile Device Management (MDM) for E-Shiksha tablets to enable centralized monitoring and reporting.
- Pilot implementation of a Digital Examination Result Platform for a few Ekal Vidyalaya.
- Development of a Unique Student Identification System to strengthen academic tracking, monitoring, and data-driven decision-making across the Ekal network.

Ekal Sansthan will continue to strengthen its role as the intellectual and innovation hub of Ekal Abhiyan by expanding university partnerships, scaling experiential learning programmes, advancing research and impact assessment, strengthening volunteer capacity building and accelerating digital transformation to support evidence-based, sustainable rural development.

Amplifying Impact Through Digital Storytelling



Established on 15 August 2023, Ekal Bharat Media Foundation (EBMF) serves as the official digital media and communication platform of Ekal Abhiyan. Its primary objective is to document, preserve and communicate the inspiring stories emerging from rural and tribal Bharat, while showcasing the transformative impact of Ekal's Panchmukhi Shiksha model to audience across India and the world.

Through documentaries, podcasts, event coverage, interviews and digital campaigns, EBMF connects donors, volunteers, policy makers, youth and the wider society with the realities of grassroots development. During 2025–26, the Foundation significantly expanded its digital outreach, strengthened audience engagement and emerged as an important communication bridge for the entire Ekal ecosystem.

Grand Ekal Shri Ram Katha by BLSP

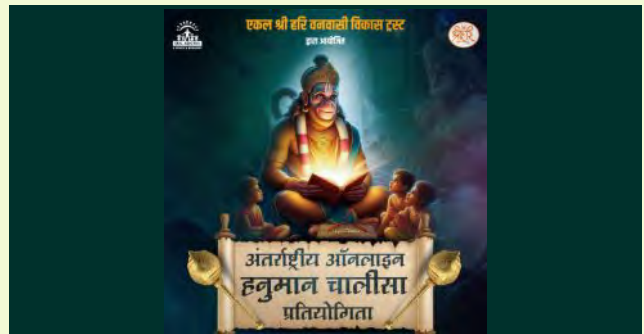

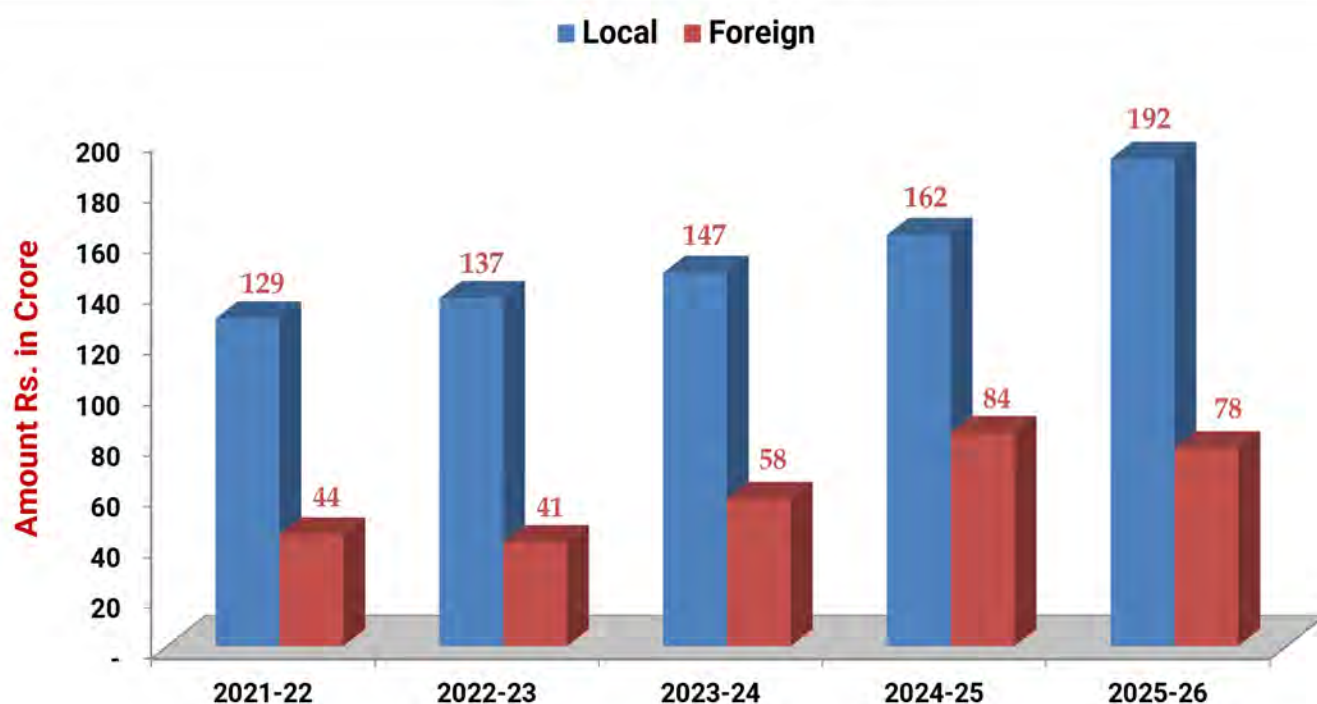
Jammu's Largest Soldiers' Felicitation Program

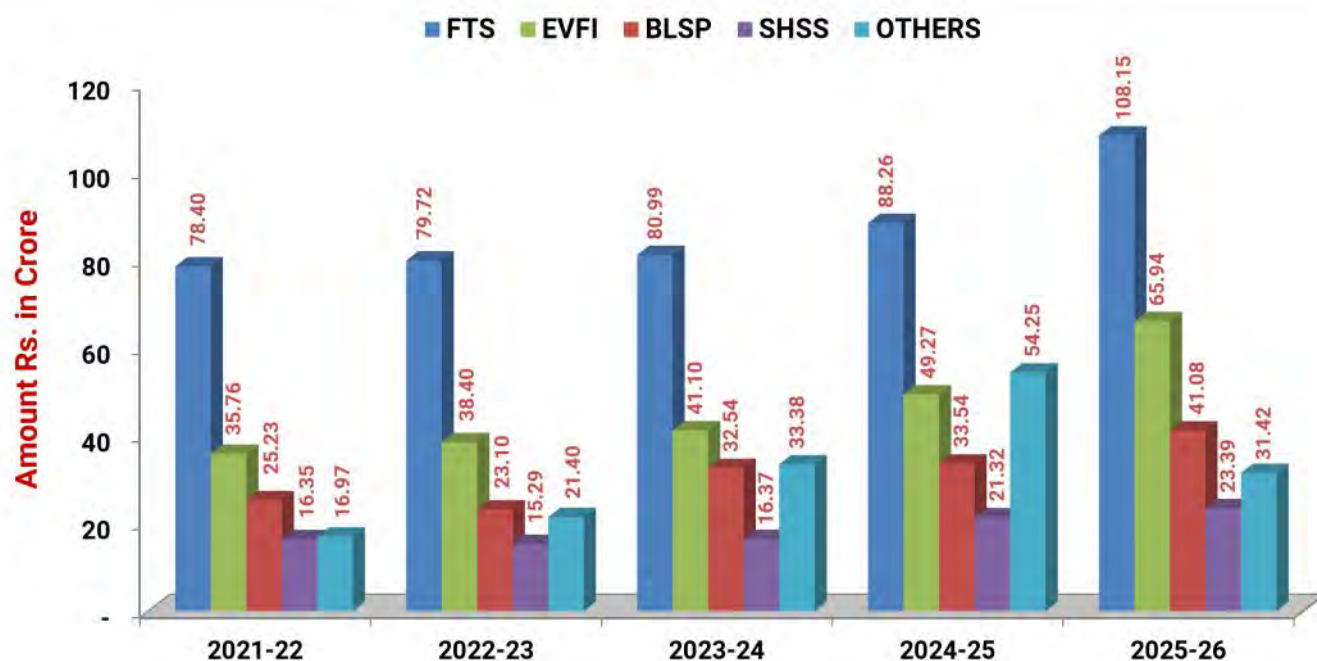

As Ekal Abhiyan moves forward in its mission of holistic rural transformation through Panchmukhi Shiksha, the coming year will focus on strengthening organizational effectiveness, enhancing coordination and deepening grassroots impact. Guided by the evolving needs of society and the experience gained over the years, several strategic priorities have been identified for the future.

The key focus will be on strengthening organizational integration and ensuring greater coordination among all affiliated institutions. Efforts will be made to enhance transparency, streamline governance structures and establish effective mechanisms for representation, participation and accountability across the organization.

Quality and sustainability will remain at the centre of programme implementation. While continuing to expand in remote, tribal, border and sensitive regions, greater emphasis will be placed on improving the effectiveness of existing initiatives and developing visible models of integrated village development. The organization will also work towards strengthening monitoring, evaluation and impact assessment systems.

Technology and innovation will play an increasingly important role in enhancing

efficiency and outreach. Efforts will continue to strengthen digital systems, improve communication and reporting mechanisms and promote knowledge sharing across various dimensions of Ekal's work. Research, documentation and policy support functions will also be further integrated into the organizational framework.

Community participation will remain the cornerstone of Ekal's approach. Greater efforts will be made to strengthen village-level institutions, encourage local leadership and deepen the involvement of families, youth and women in developmental activities. At the same time, initiatives promoting cultural values, social harmony, environmental responsibility and national consciousness will continue to be expanded.

Ekal Abhiyan will also continue to strengthen its engagement with supporters and partner organizations in India and abroad, while enhancing systems for transparency, communication and donor relations.

With a firm commitment to service, self-reliance and nation-building, Ekal Abhiyan will continue its efforts to create empowered villages, responsible citizens and vibrant communities, contributing to the vision of a strong, harmonious and developed Bharat.
